I. Three Types of people.

- A. The _____ person – An unbeliever who has not repented and believed the gospel.
- B. The _____ person – A believer who is trusting in the power of the Holy Spirit to live the Christian Life.
- C. The _____ (fleshly, worldly) person – A believer who has repented and believed the gospel, but who is trusting in his/her own efforts to try and live the Christian life.

II. Two Types of Forgiveness.

- A. _____ Forgiveness – we are made right with God (justified) because we repented and believed the gospel.
 - 1. This is a one-time, permanent forgiveness of _____ sins. This occurs at the time of our salvation (Psalm 103:3, Acts 13:39).
 - 2. We are permanently _____ into the family of God. We are now in relationship with Him.
- B. _____ Forgiveness – this is forgiveness offered when we strain the relationship and break fellowship with God.
 - 1. This forgiveness may occur multiple times in our lives and is received when we _____ (agree with God) our sin.
